The first round of the Health Research Fellowships are now open for applications. The Health Research Fellowships provide a suite of health and medical research fellowships for early to mid and late career medical, nursing, allied health and other health researchers wishing to base themselves in Queensland. Level one experienced researchers receive up to \$150,000 pa for salary support and Level two early to mid career researchers receive up to \$125,000 pa for salary support.

Their five-year research projects will encompass respectively heart disease; infectious diseases such as methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus; and chronic lung diseases in children such as asthma and cystic fibrosis. The Queensland Senior Clinical Research Fellowships, are Australia's most generous clinical research fellowships. Funding of up to \$850,000 pa for five years inclusive of laboratory and staff support is available for up to six successful fellows. The next round will open in late 2009.
